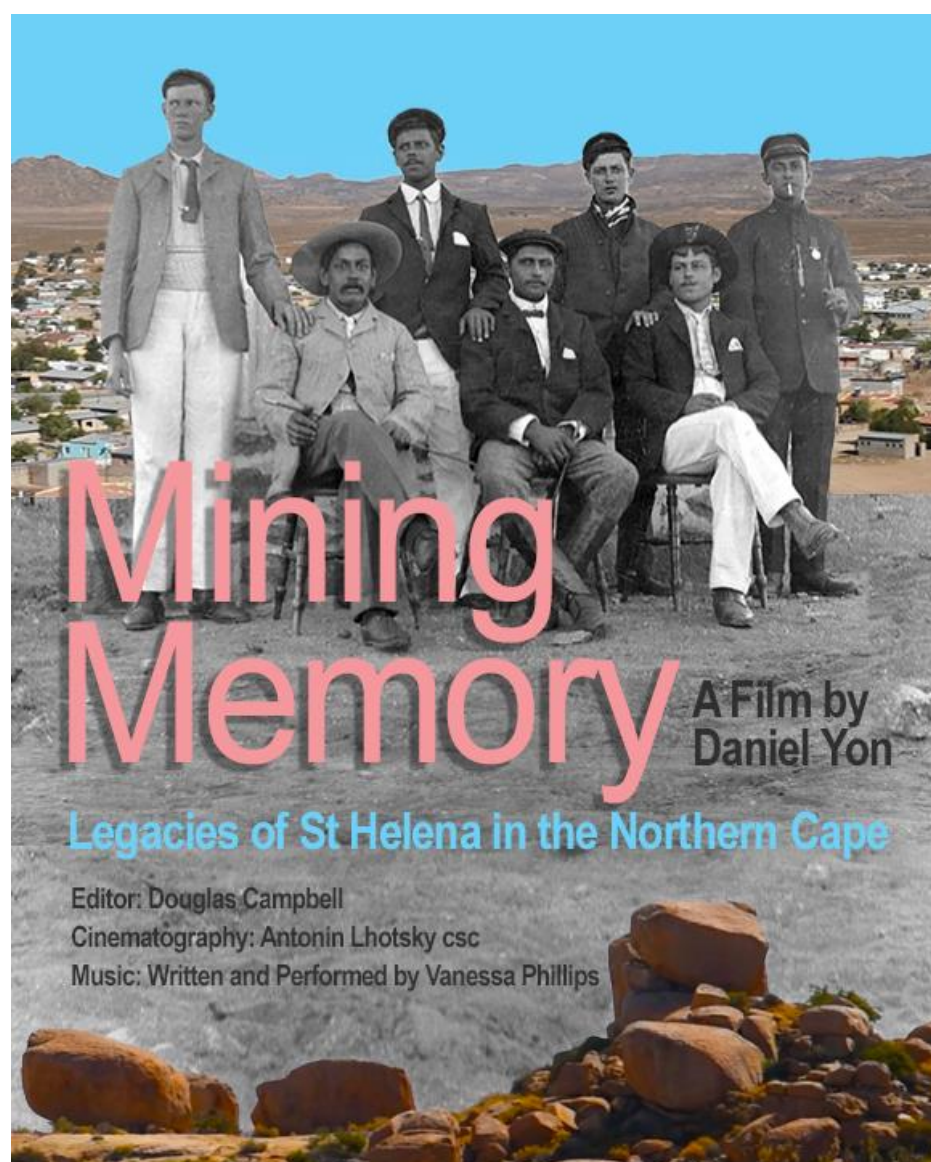


# FILM SCREENING

### Legacies of St Helena in the Northern Cape



*Considered neither 'European' or 'Native', the St Helenian immigrants who found themselves in the small mining community of Concordia, Namaqualand in 1907, were confronted with a bewildering social climate in a barren land.*

*Locals of St Helenian descent share stories of their ancestors', with themes of race, heritage and the significance of 'place', both real and imagined, being explored. Fragmented, inherited memory of St Helena are interwoven with the mining remains on the landscape such that Mining Memory is also a meditation on the social and ecological legacy of copper mining in Concordia and beyond.*
